How do I Order?

- 1. Simply grab your child's Book Club catalogue and either sign in or register your account.
- 2. Click on ORDER and then select your school and your child's class*.
- 3. Add your child's first name & last initial (so the school knows who the book is for) PLEASE NOTE: Your child's details will never be shared with 3rd parties OR used for marketing purposes this is for distribution purposes only.
- 4. Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue.
- 5. All orders are sent directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will still be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.
- 6. Afterwards, there's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details back to your school!

Seasons for Growth^o Children's Program



Invitation

The popular and successful 'Seasons for Growth Program' is being offered again at St. Kevin's this year by our Family Liaison Officer Mrs. Mc Donnell, who is a trained and experienced Seasons For Growth Companion. This 8 session peer support program offers children the chance to explore and understand what happens when they experience significant change and loss in their lives for example through parental separation, divorce, death or the passing away of someone that they were close to. It incorporates different forms of learning e.g. prayer circles, reflective art activities, discussions, dance, singing and meditation. Children learn about how change is a natural part of life and that others are experiencing similar changes too by using the analogy of the four seasons. The Program is run during school hours and there is no cost for participation, there is an accompanying workbook supplied by the school. Seasons for Growth is offered to children in years 2-6 and at least one year after the loss or significant change took place. Children are welcome to return to the program year on year as the material changes as they get older.

The Seasons For Growth program starts in term 1 this year. If you think your son or daughter would benefit from the 'Seasons' program we would encourage you to talk to them about this. Should he/she decide to participate please return the return sheet below, by Wednesday 20th February latest.
