### Compass Student Management App

#### Have you accessed our Compass App yet?

So far 60% of families have downloaded the app! We would love to have 100%!!

Some families have entered attendance notes ahead of time. Please ensure that all student absences are explained – our attendance roll is a legal document.

#### What's new

- Parents can add attendance notes through the app (see detailed instructions here).
- Attendance Policy: it is the responsibility of the parent to notify the school and explain <u>any</u> student absence.
- SMS Alerts for Student Absences: If your child has been marked absent without a prior explanation, an SMS will be sent to parents at 9:30am. There will be a one-time only link to the parent portal to explain this absence. Parents are able to enter absence notes in compass ahead of time or when the student returns to school.
- Semester 2 Reports: Will only be available via the Compass Parent Portal (Student reports will <u>not</u> be emailed this semester).





We also made posters promoting a clean environment and recycling. Outside of our theme, we made bliss balls in the kitchen, Oobleck slime for science, a singing and dancing day and relay races, to list just a few of our exciting activities for the week!
