Yesterday was **National Safer Internet Day**.

A day to stop and reflect on what it takes to be safe online. Students have been learning about how to be safe during STEM lessons this week. They have discussed a number of helpful strategies to ensure they stay safe online such as:

- keeping personal information private – never share your name, address, phone number, school, age or personal details online.
- Use a code name instead of your real name when playing online games or using apps
- Always checking with an adult first before entering details online
- Never post images or video of yourself or others to public websites or apps
- Check that your settings are on private and are age appropriate

Students also learnt about how to be respectful online and what cyberbullying can look like. Some strategies discussed:

- Always be kind and caring online
 - Once you post something online it's there forever
 - If you see someone being hurtful online stand up and speak up – tell a trusted adult – don't be a bystander
- Finally, students learnt about what to do if something isn't right.
- Understanding the difference between a friend we can high 5 and play with in the playground and a stranger online that you chat to in a game.
 - When you see or feel something isn't right – STOP – and get help straight away – Parents, teachers, trusted adult.
 - Never agree to meet someone online
 - People online can be tricky, they may be pretending to be someone else.

Today Students in Yr 3-6 have participated in a Safer Internet Day webinar. The webinar was run by the eSafety Commissioner and supported by the Broken Bay Catholic Schools Office. The eSafety Commissioner is also running parent webinars this week. Details are below.

The canteen is open for lunch on Monday's for sushi only. Note: The canteen is not open at recess.



Keep our St Kevin's kids safe!

School zones operate between 8 - 9.30am and 2.30 - 4pm on school days.

The speed limit is 40km in all school zones.

We aim to improve road safety in our school zone area, for all our families, students and staff to help protect children on their way to and from school.

It's important to understand the road rules in the school zone area outside St Kevin's Catholic Primary School. Please assist us by keeping our roads safe and remember child safety is paramount.

The Northern Beaches Council conduct patrols during school terms to ensure child safety around our school. Avoid the fine and take time to make the safe choice for our kids.



How to be safe in the Kiss N' Ride zone.

No parking zones can be used to drop off and pick up children.



Drivers may stop to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of 2 minutes.



The driver must remain in or within 3 metres of the car.



Do not leave the vehicle unattended.

No u-turns in school zone



Do not perform a u-turn in front of school traffic crossing or in a school zone.

No double parking



Vehicles must not stop next to legally parked vehicles, even for a short time.

No parking over driveways



Do not park across or on a driveway or any other vehicle access way.




How do I Order?

1. Simply grab your child's Book Club catalogue and either sign in or register your account.
2. Click on ORDER and then select your school and your child's class*.
3. Add your child's **first name & last initial** (so the school knows who the book is for) PLEASE NOTE: Your child's details will never be shared with 3rd parties OR used for marketing purposes - this is for distribution purposes only.
4. Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue.
5. All orders are sent directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will still be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.
6. Afterwards, there's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details back to your school!





Top 5 online safety tips



- 1 Think of others' feelings** before you post, like or share content.
- 2 Ask for permission** before you share a photo or video with someone else in it. Respectful online relationships start with consent.
- 3 Be an upstander** Speak up if you see someone cyberbullying or sharing nudes in a group chat – let them know that's not okay. Report and delete it.
- 4 Use privacy and screen time** settings to take control of your digital life and its impact on your mental health.
- 5 Ask for help** Cyberbullying and sharing intimate images without consent can be distressing, but eSafety can help remove them.
