Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is a forty-day period before Easter. We skip Sundays when we count the forty days, because Sundays commemorate the Resurrection.

Lent begins on Wednesday 26 February 2020 and ends on 11 April 2020, which is the day before Easter. Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days.

For science, we replicated what happens when it rains, using a glass jar, some hot water and 4 ice cubes! A scavenger hunt also got us thinking as we searched the school finding different plants, bugs and birds and learning a little bit about each of them.

This week, we had a talent quest on Monday that showed off our students dancing and singing abilities. On Tuesday, we made banana bread from scratch, an activity as fun as it was tasty! On Wednesday, we used recycled materials, such as tissue boxes and paper towel rolls, to make musical instruments. Thursday and Friday, we had a 'rainbow in a jar' science experiment and painted an 'end of Summer' poster, respectively!
