








What does your child's time at school look like?



Kindergarten to Year 6 includes four Stages of learning:


- Early Stage 1 Kindergarten

"Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) mission is to support parents as the first and foremost educators of their children, and the role they play in their child's faith formation, learning and wellbeing."

What is school readiness?

- · School readiness is about children having the tools they need to be independent learners.
- · Social skills how do they interact with other children?
- Emotional maturity how do they manage when things don't go their way?
- · Language skills can they communicate their needs and ideas? Do they recognise that letters and numbers are not just squiggles?
- · Cognitive skills can they take turns?
- · Physical health and coordination holding a pencil, balance, jumping.
- Independence taking the lid off their lunchbox.
- · Basic skills to manage their needs without adult assistance.

School readiness isn't about whether your child can read or has some maths skills. It's more about whether your child is mature enough to thrive in the school environment Children can start school if they turn 5 before 31 July. They must be enrolled by their 6th birthday.



They will learn to:

- Negotiate with others and take turns
- Recite the alphabet
- Count
- Read
- Write their name
- Have fun learning

Some of the things my child will learn in Kindy

Their learning will take place across 8 KLAs (Key Learning Areas):

- English Science
- Geography
- · PD/H/PE Mathematics
 - Creative Arts
- · Religion or Ethics History
- Coding

To talk about their thinking and learning, they will undertake Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) as well as Positive Behaviours for Learning (PBL).

How can I help my child with school readiness?

- · Spend time as a family and give lots of affection.
- · Encourage responsibility by giving your child jobs or tasks
- Talk about how you feel and encourage them to talk about their feelings too. ie model how to talk about feelings
- · Practice turn taking.

Focus on the things your child does well

- · Introduce charts, rosters or lists to help form memory for
- · Get excited about school!
- · Talk to your child about what YOU loved at school.
- Buy stationery, uniform and lunchbox together. Let them use Extend their ability to follow multi-step instructions. and wear these well before school to get used to them.
- Take them on excursions where they have the opportunity to
 Encourage them to share their ideas and thinking by asking experience hands on learning.
- · Talk about the opportunities they will have at school.
- · Visit the school often, come for Playgroup on Tuesdays or Thursdays in Term 2 from 9.15-10.30am (check the St Kevin's website for dates).

What to practice:

- READ every day with your child. (Aim for 1.000 books) between birth and starting school).
- . Teach your child to recognise their written name.
- · Help them to be independent with their belongings such as opening their lunch box and water bottle, taking their jumper off and packing their bag.
- · Support them with social cues when meeting new people such as looking at them and asking a question.
- · Teach them independent toilet skills.
- open-ended questions such as: Tell me what you're doing? Why do you think ...? How do you know ...? Why do you think that happened? How do you think it could work? What does it remind you of? I wonder why ...?
- · Help them to understand that making mistakes is ok and we can learn from them.

Supervision



Before School

Staff are on duty in the playground from 8.25am. No supervision before this time.

After School

Teacher supervision is provided for the crossing on Oaks Avenue. Children are expected to make their way home promptly.

Before and After School Care

St Kevin's Kids Club provides supervision for registered children each morning from 7am - 8.25am and each evening from 3.15pm - 6.00pm.

The provider of this service is OOSH Northern Beaches.

Kiss and Ride



- Operates daily from 3.05pm 3.30pm on Oaks Ave.
- Laminated family name card is to be displayed on the windscreen of your car, every day.

Lunchboxes

- United in Love
- Your child will be opening and closing their lunchbox 4 times a day! Please ensure the lunchbox fits in the school bag and is a small size. No 'handbag' lunchboxes or tricky lid ones your child can't open.
- Please be mindful of allergies in other children at school
 - i.e. no nuts







Lunch Options





Please pack every day:

- Small container of fruit/vegetables (eaten at 10am in class)
- Morning tea (eaten at 11am)
- Lunch (eaten at 12.50pm)



Other option....

- St Kevin's uses LunchFox a service that provides parents with an App to order lunches from local cafes.
- Lunches are delivered directly in one bulk order to the school.
- Orders must be placed by midnight the night before.

Student Attendance



- Late arrivals and early departures must be signed in at the school office (Do not add an attendance via compass)
- Absence from school parents enter the absence into Compass
- Extended absence/travel please email the school office with absentee dates ahead of time.
 For more than 10 days absence at any one time, a form must be signed by the Principal

Set the expectation early

- Good attendance starts with families making school a priority
- Absences add up quickly



- Set good patterns from Kindergarten
- But remember, it's never too late to start improving attendance

Office Administration

- Medical/Sick Bay



- A medical form will need to be completed if your child requires any medication at school
- **Sick bay** is beside the school office. The school services team have first aid training.




Parent Engagement

- Parent engagement is all about staying connected to your child's learning and school experience, even when life gets busy. It doesn't always require being physically present at school. Small, consistent actions can make a big impact. Reading the fortnightly newsletter and chatting with your child about what's happening at school is a great start.
